ⁱ Ms. Westcott states: "I wholeheartedly agree with and support this petition. It has become increasingly more difficult for both myself and my customers to enter & exit safely. I have witnessed several accidents at Menlo Place where drivers refuse to slow down for motorists trying to turn off of Mt. Hope – and even more 'close calls' at Menlo, Robinson and my own driveway. Addressing this problem is long overdue."

ⁱⁱ Mr. Psyllos states that, with the exception of camera enforcement, he supports the petition "to help make Mt. Hope Avenue a safer place to live and operate a business in." Mr. Psyllos further states: "We understand that the city and/or county transportation department(s) prefers to keep the traffic flow moving on Mt. Hope Avenue, however, during certain times of the day, it is very difficult to pull out onto Mt. Hope Avenue and head either North or South, without risking life and limb. With the removal of the pre-existing traffic light at the South entrance to the Mt. Hope Cemetery, there have been numerous traffic accidents where cars pulled out into Mt. Hope Avenue from Stewart Street or one of our parking lots onto Mt. Hope Avenue and were either rear-ended or broad-sided by oncoming traffic (that is usually moving at a pretty fast speed)." Mr. Psyllos supports proposed action items 2-5 and 7 and proposes, as an additional action item, that a traffic light be installed at the intersection of Mt. Hope Ave. and Stewart St.

ⁱⁱⁱ Mr. Caffrey states that "[t]rying to turn into my driveway from Mt. Hope Ave. is just plain treacherous!" and notes that there have been "many, many accidents at the entrance of Castle Park from Mt. Hope. I know because I'm the person who ends up calling 911."

^{iv} Mrs. Bleeg states that "[w]e have had several serious accidents right in front of our house near the top of the hill [on Mt. Hope Ave. between Highland Ave. and Reservoir Ave.]," and that "[p]eople do not stop for me when I am trying to cross the street in marked zones." Mrs. Bleeg proposes the following additional action items: (1) installing a rotary (round-about) at some point along Mt. Hope Ave., perhaps near the north entrance to the cemetery, to slow traffic, and (2) installing rumble strips at several points along Mt. Hope Ave.

^v Mr. Bleeg states: "Speeding is constant on Mt. Hope, especially bad for drivers going north from Highland to Ford St." Mr. Bleeg emphasizes his support for installing red light camera enforcement at the intersection of Mt. Hope Ave. and Cypress St. (action item no. 6). Mr. Bleeg proposes the following additional action items: (1) installing a rotary (round-about) at the intersection of Mt. Hope Ave. and Robinson Dr., and (2) installing rumble strips at least on the north-bound lane of Mt. Hope Ave. at several points between Highland Ave. and McLean St.

^{vi} Mr. Rzepka states that Reservoir Ave. is often used as a "cut through" between South Ave. and Mt. Hope Ave. to avoid the light at Mt. Hope Ave. and Highland Ave., and proposes, as an additional action item, that speed bumps be installed on Reservoir Ave.

^{vii} Ms. Andrews proposes, as an additional action item, that speed bumps be installed on Linden St.

^{viii} Ms. Avignone proposes, as an additional action item, that speed bumps be installed on Linden St.

^{ix} Mr. Bohn notes that excessive speeding is also a chronic problem on South Ave. between Highland Hospital and Highland Ave. Mr. Bohn states that "I have a 5 year old son and it is so bad that I often still have to carry him across South Ave. at the Reservoir intersection. It is not uncommon for vehicles to be pushing 50 m.p.h. and they certainly do not yield for pedestrian traffic. In my 15 years at this residence I have never even once seen a patrol car attempting to slow/calm traffic much less write tickets for gross offenders."

^x Mrs. Smith states that she lives on Mt. Hope Ave. in the second house north of the traffic light at Highland Ave., that she has witnessed many "red light runners" at that location, and that exiting her driveway is difficult because of this problem. Mrs. Smith proposes the following additional action items: (1) installing a red light camera in the existing traffic light at Mt Hope Ave. and Highland Ave., and (2) converting that intersection to "no turn on red" or employing an arrow in the light to indicate when a right turn is permitted.

^{xi} Mr. Smith proposes the following additional action items: (1) "signage at the crest of Mt. Hope heading northbound of the severity of the grade of this hill and possibly warning drivers to slow down," and (2) a traffic light at the north entrance to the cemetery, due to the business of that area.

^{xii} Mr. Thomas states: "We see it every day and night. Two days ago a car drove into the fence near our house. Once a driver drove up on our lawn."

^{xiii} Mr. Greco states: "On October 10, 2014, I was turning from Mt. Hope Ave. into my driveway. I looked in the rear-view mirror – a car with 4 kids was coming behind me (60 mph?). I floored the gas, and cut in front of a northbound car onto Stewart St. The car behind me sped towards Elmwood, but I heard a HUGE tire screech 3 seconds after I turned."

^{xiv} Mr. Orman states: "There have been many accidents on my block (Mt. Hope between Linden and Cypress) where speeding vehicles have lost control and jumped the curb. We feel particularly vulnerable on our block because our houses are so close to the street."
